#### To God be the glory!!

People of God, we are blessed to bear witness to this milestone marking 200 years of service in the mission of God's Gospel. I look forward to celebrating a high time of worship and a sacred time of re-dedication of the membership as we enter the 201<sup>st</sup> year of First Baptist Church's existence. It clearly pleased God, the *Master Orchestrator*, to bring us together in this moment in time to grow us up together in Christ's love and to prepare this church to be an even greater blessing in the world today. 

## CHRISTIAN YOUTH CONFERENCE (CYC) 2024 @ OCEANWOOD

This summer, 47 high school students, along with 50 staff, gathered in Ocean Park for the 2024 Conference. Once again, it was two unforgettable weeks of faith, fun, and fellowship. We built a Christ-centered community, embracing the diversity of our students and staff as we journeyed together in faith.

Each day, students participated in dynamic classes, uplifting chapel services, and activities designed to help them grow in their relationship with Jesus. We



worshipped, studied, and laughed together, all while deepening our discipleship. From engaging Bible studies to leadership training, CYC prepared students not just to survive, but to thrive in their faith, even when the world throws challenges their way. It was a time of growth and joy!

We also faced malicious mosquitos, slippery bathroom floors, and deep mud puddles, amidst constant orbeez battles. Many days, the heat soared or the rain poured. There was even an alien invasion that included the kidnap of a time-traveling Ann Hasseltine as well as all of Camps Hasseltine and Judson. Dancing ensued. Definitely, no shortage of fun.

As always, we couldn't have done it without the support of our broader CYC community—parents, pastors, alumni. We are also grateful to Oceanwood and the OPA for hosting us. Thank you for sending your teens, praying for us, and standing with us as we continue to grow in this important ministry.

## CYC REFLECTIONS FROM EXECUTIVE MINISTER MARY DAY HAMEL

In August I had the unique experience of spending two weeks with the Christian Youth Conference at our <u>Oceanwood Camp</u>. In previous years, I have "visited" CYC, but this was much more of an immersion! I taught classes each day and participated in many of the regular Conference activities. CYC began in 1915 and is rich in history and tradition, but has continued to evolve and grow to meet the needs of the current day.

CYC is a three-year experience for high school students, that "builds a solid foundation of faith and prepares teens for a life of discipleship." This is not your average youth camp, though there is no shortage of fun! CYC is designed for young people who are ready to "go deep" with their faith and develop the foundation they need to face the challenges of young adulthood in today's world. Many CYC graduates continue in Christian leadership development by returning as cabin staff. A significant number of leaders in our churches are CYC alumni.

The young people I met at CYC were flat-out amazing: committed, caring, insightful. They have a unique experience developing a community with an impressively diverse group from all around New England. The only thing more amazing than the teens was the faculty and staff. Not a more dedicated group can be found anywhere! I am so grateful for the leadership of our own Rev. Melinda Parry (FBC Wakefield), CYC Dean. Our Oceanwood staff did a great job hosting the Conference!




#### RELIEF FOR HURRICANE HELENE AND MILTON

#### **Pull-Tabs for Shriners Hospital**

Are you aware that for years we've been collecting pull-tabs from beverage cans – and we're still doing it? Why? Here's the story.

Shriners Hospitals in Springfield and Boston have been collecting pull-tabs or "pop-tops" from beverage cans since 1989, recycling them, and putting the money toward programs that directly benefit children. The pull-tabs are the only pure aluminum part of the beverage can, and there are approximately 1,200 to 1,400 tabs in one pound. Since the program's inception, about a half-million pounds of aluminum tabs have been collected and recycled.

We donate the tabs to the Shriners' Burns Hospital – Boston. Neil Patterson coordinates this project, and Ken Shaw delivers the tabs to the hospital. There is a plastic jug in the Reception Room at church where you can leave the tabs you have removed from beverage cans.

Their website reminds us that Shriners' Children's Hospitals are "always here for our patients, regardless of a family's ability to pay or insurance status".

You can help a Shriner help a child. Donate pull-tabs for recycling.

Flyers for the Holly Fair will be available in the Narthex mid-November for church family to distribute in local stores, share at club meetings or hand out to friends and neighbors.




